Terms and Conditions

- 1. Entries must reflect the theme: Sacred Symbols
- 2. Entries can be submitted electronically at: www.interfaithfestival.com.au/art-competition. Alternatively, entry forms can be mailed to 'Mornington Peninsula Interfaith Festival 2010 Art Exhibition 16 Bay Rise Drive, Mornington VIC 3931' by closing date: **5pm Friday 8th October 2010.** Please Note: An image of each work MUST accompany your entry form.
- 3. Each entrant can submit a maximum of 2 works. All works must be original and exclusive work of the individual.
- 4. Works must be 2 dimensional and can be paintings, drawings, prints, photographs or works on paper. Submissions must not exceed 1.5m in height or width.
- 5. All School Category entry forms must be signed by a legal guardian or parent.
- 6. Entrants will be contacted by the 15th October and told if their works have been successfully accepted for display at the Mornington Peninsula Interfaith Festival on Sunday 14th of November at the Peninsula Community Theatre (corner of Nepean Highway and Wilsons Road Mornington).
- 7. Successful entrants will be required to sign a consignment form (pick-up & delivery times, description of work etc). For artists looking to sell their work, a 15% commission will be incurred for each work sold.
- 8. All accepted works must be ready to hang and framed properly. Canvases may be unframed. Wet or incomplete works will not be accepted.
- 9. A Judging Panel will select the winning entry for each category and award a certificate to the runner up. All members of the judging panel must remain impartial and are not allowed to submit entries to the competition. Winners will be announced on Sunday the 14th of November 2010, approximately 3:30pm.
- 10. The Mornington Peninsula Interfaith Festival committee will take all care to protect and preserve the submitted work but are not responsible for insurance, loss or damage of entries.
